Secretary's Report: Minutes of November 20, 2024 meeting approved.

Town Representative Updates:

- 1. North Kingstown
 - a. Aaron gave a brief description of NK and Chipuxet River connection to WP Watershed. Groundwater is of particular concern to the town because they are 100 per cent dependent on their aquifers. There are concerns about PFAs in groundwater, particularly near Quonset.
 - b. Part of the work being done in NK is resilience due to its proximity to the bay and climate change. Looking at dealing with impermeable surfaces.
 - c. Another important issue is access to public rights-of-way.
- 2. Exeter
 - a. The Conanicus property, about 300 acres and includes the dam that contains the Slocum Reservoir has been put up for sale. The Council has drafted a letter to the Episcopal Diocese in support of conserving the property. RIDEM has expressed interest in purchasing the property and is working to raise the funds.
 - b. Solar farm on property off Rt. 102 was installed before ordinance was changed and is a cause of concern.
 - c. Shartner Farm proposed hydroponic structure is stalled because investors have pulled out, the company needs to pay back taxes, and there are 38 conditions they must meet for RIDEM.
 - d. The town changed the requirements for the Conservation Commission to 5 members instead of 7, which should make it easier to convene the commission.
 - e. Rain garden at town hall and library are doing great.

Committee Updates:

 - a. Four Initiatives were proposed and discussed (See attachments)
 - i. Community Support Proposal was removed from consideration due to the extensive time requirements.
 - b. Review and discuss Committee Budgets (5 minutes to present each)
 - i. Advisory Committee request \$7,000 for GIS work, maintaining existing maps, and scoping out need for new maps, and \$12,000 for Working Group Program.
 - ii. Projects Committee request \$60,000 for Community Grants
 - iii. I&E requests \$18,000
 - iv. WPWA requesting \$10,000 and WLT requesting \$1,400 for Water Quality
 - c. 2025-26 Budget and workplan update
 - i. Executive Committee will meet in January and make recommendations for the budget.
 - ii. Casey will send out a vote asking the Council to rank the initiatives.
 - d. TerraCorps service member research
 - i. Will work with WLT as our sponsor.
 - ii. The application is competitive but not too much so it's possible WLT can recruit their own intern
 - iii. Based on their sliding scale it will likely cost close to \$12,500. We would also need to budget another \$3,000 for computer and training.
 - iv. 2025/2026 application opens beginning of March
 - v. We will need to do advertising local to recruit potential interns

 - b. EPA put out revisions to sections of their hand book on water quality standards that may affect W&S Rivers in a positive way. Looking for comment by March 12, 2025.

- 5. Wood-Pawcatuck Watershed Association
 - a. Fully funded for engineering design and permitting phase for culvert replacement of culvert on Hillsdale Road over the Beaver River. Application for wetland permit will be submitted in March. Construction costs are estimated to be \$900,000.

 - a. TNC purchased and protected a 25-acre property in Hopkinton and 90-acre property in West Greenwich.
